Siva Mahimaamrutham – The essence of the divine greatness and supreme nature of Lord Siva, the eternal source of consciousness and liberation. Known as the destroyer and transformer in the Holy Trinity along with Brahma (creator) and Vishnu (preserver), he clears away ignorance and ego, making way for growth and spiritual awakening. His third eye symbolizes inner vision and wisdom. The river Ganga flowing from his hair shows his power to purify and bless the world. His ash-covered body reminds us that all material things will one day return to dust. His trident (Trishul) stands for control over body, mind, and soul. The crescent moon on his head represents time and the cycles of life. Siva's greatness is described in many scriptures, such as the Siva Mahimna Stotram, the Siva Purana, and the Rudram from the Vedas.
