Our IT team has also worked hard to bring in technology where needed to assist with messaging and easing the burden on our front office team.


Hanuman Yaagam will be performed at Shiva-Vishnu Temple from January 30th to February 2nd, 2025.







He was a university topper in MA from the same University. He has also passed the Archaka Pravesa, Vara and Pravara examinations conducted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh with first class. He is a Gold Medalist from Sri Venkateshwara Veda Shastra Agama Vidvath Sadassu in Krishna Yajurveda Smartham. He worked as a priest in Ayyappa Swamy Devalaya in Prodattur, for about 2 years before joining us here in June 2022. He is well tversed in all rituals of Vaideekam and Smartham. He speaks Telugu, Tamil, English, Hindi and Sanksrit.

PDT. Ganapati Bhat is a Smartha Priest. He hails from Yellapur, Karnataka. He is a Krishna Yajurveda Salakshana Ghanapathi from Karnataka Samsrita University, Chamarajapet, Bangalore after 15 years of study. He is a Gold Medalist from in Krishna Yajurveda Mula Kramantha Salakshana Ganantha and Boudayana Apasthamba Smartha Prayoga conducted by Karnataka Samsrita University, Chamarajapet, Bangalore. He worked as a private priest (Purohitam) in Bangalore for 15 years before joining us in August 2022. He hails from a family of priests going back to about 7 generations. He has also studied Sanskrit Pradhama and Kavya. He is well trained in all rituals of Vaideekam and Smartham. He speaks Kannada, English and Sanksrit.



PDT SRINIVAS PEESAPATI

PDT. Srinivas Peesapatiis a Pancharatra Aagama Priest. He hails from Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. He hails from a family of priests going back to about 9 generations. He had his initial training in Srimaan Trust, Srirangam, Tamilnad where he learnt Nalayira Divya Prabhadham and Sri Pancharathra Agamam and Aapa Stambiea Pancha Dasa Karmas. He is a Gold Medalist from TTD Veda Saras Purva Bhaga in 2014. He attained his Bachelor's of Commerce from Gitam University, Visakhapatnam in 2015. He has a Masters in Pancharathra Agama from Venkateshwara Vedic University in 2019, Tirupati and Masters in Astrology from Central Sanskrit University, Tikrupati in 2022. He has been involved in the Pratishtas, Brahmotsavams, Pavithrotsavams since the age of 12, and is also associated as priest with Sri. Kodandaramalayam, Salagramapuram, Visakhapatnam. Before starting work with us in June 2024 he was an Asst Professor in Pancharathra Agama in the Vedic

University, Tirupati. He speaks English, Hindi, Telugu, Tamil, Kannada & Sanskrit.



PDT SREERAMA DHAVALA

PDT.Sreerama Dhavala: Pandit Sree Rama Dhavala is a distinguished Smartha and Saktha Agama priest hailing from Vizianagaram, Andhra Pradesh. He holds a bachelor's degree in Smartha Agama from the prestigious Sri Venkateshwara Veda & Samskrutha Veda Pathashala, Keesaragutta, Hyderabad, following eight years of rigorous study. He further specialized in Saktha Agama (focusing on rituals and worship dedicated to Shakti as the primary deity) under the esteemed guidance of His Holiness Amrutananda Swaswathi (Dandukoori Mallikarjuna Somayaji). Pandit Dhavala has been honored for his knowledge and service by the Sringeri Sarada Trust, Sringeri, and the Virupaksha Peetham, Guntur. He is also officially certified by the endowments departments of Telangana for his expertise in performing traditional rituals and ceremonies. His skillset includes conducting Vivaham (marriages), Upanayanam (sacred thread ceremonies), and various other rituals. He is particularly adept in performing advanced rituals such as Chandi Homam, Mahavidya Homam, and Srichakra Archa (Navavarana Archana). Pandit Dhavala comes from a lineage of spiritual leaders, with his grandfather being the founder of the Sri Shankar Math in Vizianagaram, where Pandit Dhavala currently serves as the Pradhana Archaka (chief priest). Prior to joining us in July 2024, he rendered his services at SLNSS Virginia, USA. Fluent in Telugu, Hindi, and English, Pandit Sree Rama Dhavala continues to uphold and propagate traditional Hindu rituals with exceptional dedication and skill.



PDT HARIHARAN ANANDAKUMAR

PDT. Hariharan is a Shaiva Aagama Priest. He hails from Chennai, Tamilnadu. He hails from a family of priests going back to about 9 generations. He began his education in Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam in Kanchipuram, Tamilnadu where he studied for 5 years and attained a Bachelors in Shivagama Chudamani. In 2011 he attained his Masters in Shivagama from Sri Venkateshwara Vedic University, Tirupati. From 2011 to 2018 he underwent special education in Sanskrit and Astrology to attain a Diploma, Bachelors and Masters in Sanskrit & Astrology from Madras Sanskrit College Mylapore, Chennai, Tamilnadu. He is a gold medalist in a National Level Slokha Antakshari competition held in Agartala, Tripura by the All India Sanskrit Samsthan in 2018. He has been involved in Pratishtas, Brahmotsavams, Pavithrotsavams and all types of Homams since 2009. He was working in Vadapalani Murugan Temple in Chennai, Tamilnadu before he joined us. He speaks English, Hindi, Tamil, Telugu and Sanskrit.



PDT VENKATA PARASARAM

PDT Venkata Sridhar Parasaram is a Vaikhanasa priest on the Vishnu side. He hails from Guntur, Andhra Pradesh. He hails from a family of priests going back to over 9 generations. He completed his studies with first class in Vaikhanasa Agama Prathishta Prayaschitham from Sri Venkateshwara Vaikhanasa Agama Patashala in Dwarka Tirumala, West Godavari, Andhra Pradesh in 2012. He passed Archaka Pravesha Vara Examination conducted by Govt of Andhra Pradesh with First Class in 2013. He was involved in Pratishtha, Brahmotsavam, Pavitrotsavam for the last 9 years. He worked in Sri Venkateshwara Padmavathi Temple in Gadchibowli Hyderabad from 2013 to 2017. Before joining us he was a priest in the Hindu Temple and Cultural Center, Seattle, Washington from 2017 to 2022. He speaks English, Hindi, Telugu & Tamil.

Slow Time: Meditations on a Moonless Monday

On the last Monday of 2024, as devotees gather at the Livermore Temple for Somvati Amavasya, I reflect on how this simple ritual connects us to one of humanity's oldest pursuits - the search for patterns in our world. This was the last moonless Monday in the shortest days of the year.

We humans were pattern-seekers When the night sky was our only entertainment, our ancestors looked up and saw stories. The Rishis who composed the Vedas weren't just poets—they were astronomers mapping the paths of celestial bodies. Those first observations of the nakshatras, the meticulous tracking of planetary positions, and the precise calculations of lunar phases were the foundations of a science that would span millennia. The temples they built encoded this knowledge in stone - each alignment, each proportion, each measurement reflecting their understanding of cosmic patterns.

Time is the price of cosmic knowledge Let us think about what it takes to know the sky truly. To map Jupiter's path through the zodiac requires watching every single night for twelve years. That's just one basic cycle. For the complex alignments of Jupiter with Saturn, you need a full sixty-years of careful observation. A grandfather begins the observation, his son continues it, his grandson completes one cycle - and realizes they need five more cycles to be sure. There are so many generations of unbroken and diligent observations. We must have continued the observations unbroken through wars, famines, sudden wealth, and then upheaval again. If we missed a cycle, we would have had to start this journey of several generations again.

Every temple ritual is a gift from the past When we stand in a temple today, participating in ceremonies timed to celestial events, we're receiving the accumulated wisdom of hundreds of generations: astronomers who watched the skies, mathematicians who calculated the cycles, architects who encoded this knowledge into stone according to Sthapatya Veda, and priests who preserved the timing of rituals through their family traditions.

That simple act of gathering for Somvati Amavasya? It represents thousands of years of human dedication to understanding our place in the cosmos.

We still are pattern-seekers Today, we seek patterns in stock markets and social media trends. We track patterns in our lives - the rise and fall of fortunes, the cycles of fashion, the rhythms of fate. Our algorithms search for patterns in vast seas of data, just as our ancestors searched the vast ocean of stars. But standing in the temple today, participating in rituals that connect us to ancient astronomical knowledge, I am humbled by the patience of our ancestors. From those first observations of the nakshatras to the precise temple alignments, they gave us the gift of cosmic time, measured in stone, remembered in ritual, and preserved in the sacred geometry of temple architecture.

The patterns we seek today are faster and more fleeting. But we could learn something from those ancient sky-watchers about patience, the value of slow observation, and the profound insights that come only with time. Patterns set into stone, geometry, verse, and the very fabric of our sacred spaces.

As we perform our simple Monday ritual, we connect to an unbroken chain of observation and remembrance that stretches back centuries. In these ancient practices, I see an echo of our oldest pattern-seeking stories, written first in stars, then in stone, and now in light. Each temple standing today is a testament to this ancient wisdom, and every ritual is a thread connecting us to those first skywatchers who looked up and began to measure the cosmos.
